

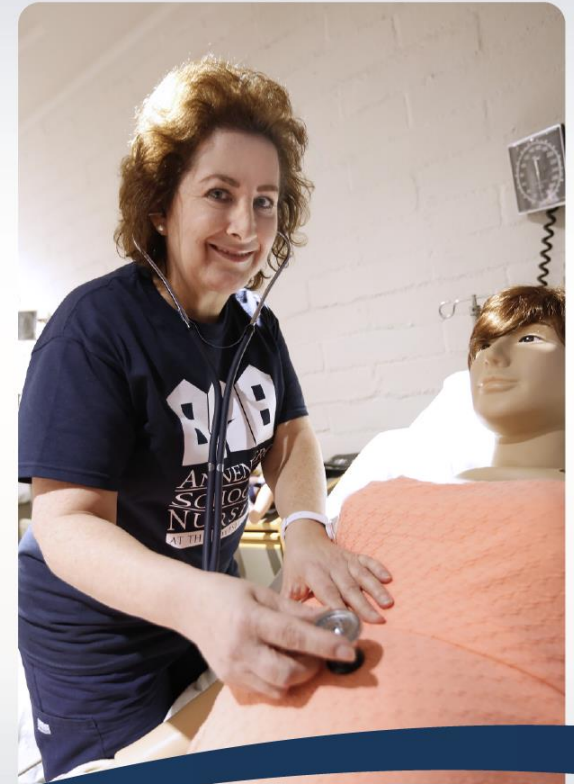

## Why Should I Become a Vocational Nurse?

- Growing demand as population ages and nurses retire
  - The number of LVN positions in America is expected to grow 25% from 2012–2022, faster than for all other occupations (average rate is 11%), according to the Bureau of Labor Statistics
  - The most job openings will be in nursing care facilities and home health care services

# What is the Curriculum for the VN Program?

- Training prepares students for National Council Licensure Examination for Practical Nurses (NCLEX-PN®)
- Full-time course of study takes approximately one year to complete (48 curricular weeks)
- Monday–Friday  
Clinical 7 a.m. – 3 p.m. or 1:30 p.m. – 9:30 p.m. (possible 12-hour shifts)  
Class 8 a.m. – 3 p.m.

# What are the Admission Requirements?

- Minimum 18 years of age
- Proof of High School Diploma or GED from the United States. Foreign transcripts or certificate (not US) must be evaluated by a transcript evaluation service to determine equivalency to US standards.
- California ID or Driver's License
- Social Security Card

If you have all of the above items, the next step is to take and pass the entrance exam.

- Pass TEAS entrance exam (Cost is \$75.00 non-refundable)

Once you pass the entrance exam you will begin the application process

- Application Package (Cost is \$100.00 non-refundable)

# Do I Have to Take an Entrance Examination?

- Yes. The Test of Essential Academic Skills (TEAS) is a pre-entry test used to evaluate the academic preparedness of students entering the vocational nursing program.
- TEAS consists of questions in:
  - Math\*
  - English\*
  - Reading\*
  - Science\*

# What is the Cost of the Program?

- **FEES:**

- TEAS exam - \$75.00 (non-refundable)
- Application fee - \$100.00 (non-refundable)

- **TUITION:**

- Total Tuition           \$25,000.00\*
- Deposit Required   \$ 1,500.00





## Does ASN Offer Financial Aid?

- \$4,000 ASN scholarships are available for all VN students.
  - Financial Aid is available for those who qualify.
    - Interest Free Loan
      - Jewish Free Loan Association offers interest free loan up to \$10,000 for eligible VN students who qualify with two co-signers, regardless of faith.
    - Federal Student Aid Title IV Funds
      - Pell Grants
      - Direct Loans

# Federal Student Aid

- How do I apply?
    - Fill out and submit the Free Application for Federal Student Aid at [www.fafsa.ed.gov](http://www.fafsa.ed.gov)
    - Put in the Annenberg School of Nursing school code: 041913
  - What types of federal student aid are available?
    - Pell Grants: up to \$5,815 for 2016-2017
    - Direct Loans: low interest Subsidized and Unsubsidized loans
