Vocational Nursing (VN)

ASN's 12-month, full-time VN class program prepares you to take the NCLEX-PN® California state licensing exam. Classes meet Monday through Friday and cover:

- Anatomy and Physiology
- Pharmacology
- Fundamentals of Nursing
- Medical Surgical Nursing
- Obstetric and Maternal Child Nursing
- Mental Health Nursing

Clinical classes are held at local hospitals, clinics, skilled nursing and rehabilitation facilities.

Our VN program prepares you for entry-level positions wherever Vocational Nurses are employed, including:

- Medical Offices
- Clinics
- HMOs
- Acute-Care Hospitals
- Long-term Care Facilities
- Other Healthcare Settings

Nursing Assistant (NA)

ASN's certified NA program is full-time Monday through Friday for 60 hours of theory and 116 clinical hours. By the end of the program, students are prepared to take the state certification examination. The curriculum includes:

- Personal Care
- Vital Signs
- Admissions, Transfers and Discharges
- Death and Dying
- Time Management
- State Requirements for Certified Nursing Assistants

Home Health Aide (HHA)

This five-day, 40-hour Monday through Friday program trains active certified Nurse Assistants to help the elderly, disabled, chronically ill, or cognitively impaired. HHAs work mainly in private homes. Home Health Aides assist with activities including:

- Medication Assistance
- Bathing and Dressing
- Light Housekeeping
- Meal Preparation
- Transportation Assistance
